\*Up to Date with vaccination: a person has received all recommended doses in their primary series COVID-19 vaccine, and a <u>booster dose</u> when eligible<sup>6</sup> \*\*Testing, symptom monitoring and increased PPE are advised after higher-risk exposure. Higher-risk exposures generally involve exposure of HCP's eyes, nose, or mouth to material potentially containing SARS-CoV-2, particularly if these HCP were present in the room for an aerosol-generating procedure<sup>5</sup> \*\*\*Testing all staff following any air travel is advisable, even when not specifically required.<sup>3</sup> See <u>CDC travel</u> section for additional guidance<sup>10</sup> ^In counties with <u>low</u> community transmission, expanded screening testing for asymptomatic HCP, regardless of vaccination status, is <u>not</u> recommended.<sup>8</sup> See *TESTING* section of <u>Interim Infection Prevention and Control Recommendations to Prevent SARS-CoV-2 Spread in Nursing Homes</u> for testing intervals of unvaccinated or immunocompromised HCP

^^See <u>Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Requirements for Long-Term Care Facility Staff</u> for PPE requirements based on procedure and transmission level<sup>9</sup> ^^^Vaccinated HCP are exempt from wearing a mask in employee only areas when community transmission levels are <u>low</u> to <u>moderate</u><sup>7</sup>

Determining transmission risk: If the tow indicators suggest different transmission levels, the higher level is selected.

Percentage of positive NAATs tests during the past 7 days**	<5%	5-7.99%	8-9.99%	≥10.0%
