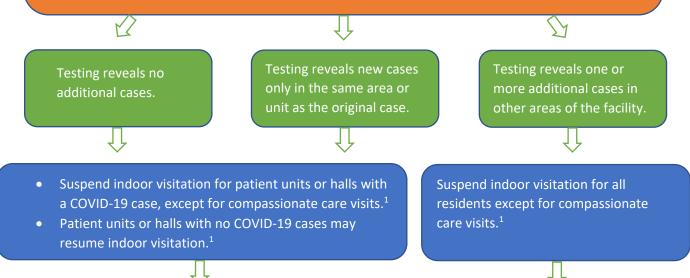


## COVID-19 Visitation Guidelines for Nursing Facilities During an Outbreak Flowchart

A Staff Member or Resident tests positive for COVID-19 (COVID-19 Outbreak)

- Suspend all visitation except compassionate care visits.<sup>1</sup>
- Immediately begin facility-wide COVID-19 outbreak testing.<sup>2</sup>
- Place all residents in quarantine and contact/droplet precautions (use of gowns and gloves).<sup>3</sup>
- Staff in close proximity to residents should wear fit-tested N95 masks and eye protection.<sup>3</sup>
- Identify residents and staff who have had prolonged close contact\* with the case.<sup>3</sup>

## For the duration of the COVID-19 outbreak until there are no new COVID-19 cases for 14 days:

- Residents with **prolonged close contact**\* (*within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more cumulatively over 24 hours*) with the COVID-19 case should continue quarantine for 14 days.<sup>3</sup>
- Residents without prolonged close contact\* with the case should generally be restricted to their rooms and consider halting communal dining and group activities.<sup>3</sup>
- Staff and residents from all units must continue to participate in outbreak testing every 3-7 days.<sup>2</sup>
- Staff in close proximity to residents should continue to wear fit-tested N95 masks and eye protection.<sup>3</sup>
- All residents should remain on contact/droplet precautions until there are no new COVID-19 cases for 14 days.<sup>3</sup>
