This messaging is for Public Information Officers (PIOs), communication partners, Community Health Workers (CHWs), and local health departments (LHDs).

COVID-19 vaccines are an important tool to help stop the pandemic. Clinical data show the COVID-19 vaccines we are using are safe and effective for everyone. Most of the side effects were mild or moderate, and the same types of symptoms you'd see with any vaccine; like a sore arm, fever, or headache. These usually went away in a day or so. Vaccines have already been given to thousands of people throughout Utah.

Our goal is to make sure everyone can get vaccinated for COVID-19 as soon as the vaccine is available. We appreciate your help letting those in your communities know it's safe and easy to get vaccinated for this deadly disease. Vaccines are available in many different locations. You can get vaccinated for COVID-19 in the area you live, or where you get medical services or healthcare.

You can get vaccinated for COVID-19 at your local health department if you live, or get medical services or healthcare, outside of the locations listed above.

Contact your [local health department](#) to schedule an appointment or to find out when vaccination clinics will be held. You must schedule your appointment ahead of time. Do not just show up without an appointment, as each local health department may have a different process for registration. Please understand we have limited vaccines and that appointments will fill up quickly. It may take a few tries to get an appointment. Click [here](#) for more details.
