



# If you are 50 or older, you can get the COVID-19 vaccine right now!

Call your local health department, pharmacy, or healthcare provider today to schedule your appointment to get vaccinated.

**COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. COVID-19 vaccines help us get our lives back. The benefits of getting vaccinated far outweigh the risks of getting the virus. COVID-19 vaccines are 100% effective against death from COVID-19.**

- All Utahns age 16 and older with specific underlying medical conditions can get vaccinated. See specific medical conditions at [coronavirus.utah.gov/vaccine-distribution](https://coronavirus.utah.gov/vaccine-distribution).
- Anyone who is eligible can get vaccinated. You don't have to be a U.S. citizen or resident. You don't have to have a social security number, but providers have to ask for one so they can get reimbursed for vaccines. If you don't remember your social security number or don't have one, you can just say, "no" when they ask. They don't give any of your information to immigration or law enforcement.
- You don't have to have health insurance to get vaccinated. You shouldn't be charged anything for the vaccine and you won't get billed later on.

## You need to:

- **Call a vaccine provider or register online to schedule an appointment. For phone numbers of vaccine providers or for online registration, visit [vaccinefinder.org](https://vaccinefinder.org).**
- If you don't have a computer or Internet access, ask someone you trust to help you register for an appointment.
- You must have an appointment. You can't just show up without an appointment because each vaccine provider may have a different process for registration. **Appointments may fill up quickly. It may take a few tries to get an appointment.**
- You have to bring something with you that has your name on it (like a photo ID, utility bill, or a signed letter from someone saying you are who you say you are).
- You may want to let the vaccine provider know ahead of time if you will need accommodations (such as language assistance or a wheelchair).
